## Hunter sight-in at Camp Guernsey

CAMP GUERNSEY, Wyo. - The Wyoming National Guard's Camp Guernsey Joint Training Center will host a free day of shooting at the camp's 1,000-yard known distance range, near Guernsey, Wyo., Sept. 4 and 27, from 7 a.m. - 5 p.m. All big game rifle hunters are welcome to sight-in their rifles at no cost.

All participants must sign a hold harmless agreement, provide proof of a hunter safety card or exemption by Wyoming State Statute, and sign in at range control (Bldg. 15). Participants must provide their own paper or plastic targets, posters, and eye and ear protection. All ages and families are welcome.

Dogs are highly discouraged, but are not prohibited, provided the owners control their animals. Specifically they must provide kennels, or have the animals remain in vehicles. When exercised, dogs must be leashed and owners must remove all feces.
